Background

During the May 14, 2009 Budget Workshop, the Department of Health and Human Services was requested to report back on where staff reasonably expect to utilize volunteers.

Discussion

DHHS has continually taken advantage of volunteer resources offered by the local community and will continue to use volunteers in the same locations and programs as was done in the past. We will explore the use of volunteers in additional programs to enhance services or fill in gaps in services as the result of budget cuts. There are limitations that restrict the services that can be performed by volunteers because of Section 71J. The utilization of volunteers is to supplement, enrich, and strengthen the delivery of services and not to replace County staff.

In 2008 DHHS had 691 volunteers and student interns and they contributed 92,080 hours of service. Below is a summary of where and how volunteers were used in the past.

Child Protective Services

Child Protective Services division partnered with Casey Family Programs and Capital Christian Center to implement the Adopt A Social Worker Program. Through this program, volunteers from the church provide donations to families in the Family Reunification program. Casey Family Programs provides free transportation of furniture donated by church volunteers. Donations include food, clothing and other household items.

County Clinics

The County Clinics have numerous agreements with volunteer organizations, individuals as well as student and intern training organizations that contribute to services provided to county patients. Below is a brief summary of the types of services, the average number of hours provided and where services are provided to serve county patients. Some of the information contained below is retrospective as statistics are collected quarterly basis by certain organizations.
