Background

During the May 14, 2009 Budget Workshop, the Department of Health and Human Services was requested to report back on the fiscal impacts if the Boys Ranch and the Warren E. Thornton Youth Center were not closed.

Discussion

The Juvenile Medical Services (JMS) program is a stand alone budget managed by the Department of Health and Human Services. JMS provides staffing, operational management, administrative support and medical services at the Probation Department's facilities for detained minors in Sacramento County. In its initial proposed budget submission, Probation Department recommended the closure of the Warren E. Thornton Youth Center (WETYC) and the Boys' Ranch. Consequently, JMS reduced its 2009-10 Proposed Budget, reflecting those closures.

Since May 14th, some funding has been restored to continue operation of the Boys Ranch. As a result, JMS has restored medical services at the Boys Ranch. Remaining unfunded is the provision of medical services at WETYC. In addition, to meet its net county cost allocation, JMS has reduced some medical services at the Juvenile Hall Youth Detention Facility (YDF).

The following table identifies the costs to restore funding for medical services at both YDF and WETYC. Excluding the 1.0 administrative support position also included as a reduction for 2009-10, the JMS Budget funding requirements to staff each site is as follows:

YDF	6.5 Plus Registry Costs	1,101,144
WETYC	4.0	475,498
Totals	10.5	1,576,642

The funding requirements to reinstate staffing for both facilities are100 % General Funded and would result in increased Net County Costs.
