Subject: TRANSIENT-OCCUPANCY TAX (TOT) 2004-05 FINAL BUDGET

**HEARINGS** 

On May 7, 2004, your Board approved the Proposed Budget for the Transient-Occupancy Tax (TOT) Fund. At that time, total available financing was anticipated to be \$9,109,605 (a 7.0 percent increase over the 2003-04 Adopted Final Budget). Funding was approved at that time for the Department of Economic Development (\$90,000), the American River Parkway Foundation (\$54,000), County Executive Administration (\$25,000), Department of Finance (Hotel Audits - \$10,000; Contract Audits - \$10,000; Revenue Estimates/Monitoring - \$25,000), Department of Neighborhood Services (\$465,056), Board of Supervisors Neighborhood Programs (\$80,000), General Fund Transfer (\$3,064,054), Sacramento Theatre Company/Music Circus (\$66,000), and the Raley Field Bond Financing Pass-Through (\$2,388,696). The remaining \$2,831,799 was left unallocated until Final Budget Hearings.

The TOT Final Budget is hereby submitted for your approval on September 2, 2004. The total available financing has increased from Adopted Proposed Budget by \$322,523 (to \$9,432,128) due to higher than anticipated prior-year tax collections. Because of the increased tax collections, tax revenue projections for Fiscal Year 2004-05 have been increased by \$122,558, reflecting 3.0 percent growth over Fiscal Year 2003-04 year-end actuals.

The County Executive is recommending that the additional \$322,523 be utilized to restore the \$200,000 Raley Field Reserve, establish a \$102,523 Contingency, and provide \$20,000 funding for the county's share of a Gold Rush Attraction Study. The remaining \$2,831,799 unallocated financing is available for your Board to allocate during the Final Budget Hearings held on September 2, 2004. Attached is a listing of the allocations approved during the Proposed Budget Hearings, the County Executive's recommendations and the remaining organizations that have requested funding for Fiscal Year 2004-05. The anticipated funding requests are the same as last year's funding level, unless the organization indicated a different amount during the TOT Proposed Budget Hearings held May 7, 2004. These amounts equal the available unallocated financing of \$2,831,799.

Following is a Summary of the County Executive's Final Budget Recommendations and requested allocations from historically funded TOT organizations:
