

- o The Department loses the ability to take corrective action, discipline or terminate an employee, which creates liability

Technology Division

If AB 109 funding was not available:

Eliminates support for AB 109 case management

Limits ability to collect AB 109 data for monthly reporting

No support for ongoing automation projects with outside agencies







- Over 100 offenders have been sentenced locally to mandatory supervision


Post Release Community Supervision




Adult Probation- Supervised
